The past year has been an amazing time for Northwest Association for Blind Athletes. We are always excited for the future but this year seemed just a little different.

In the beginning of our organization, a few friends wanted to compete in Powerlifting. At the time, we had no idea that little "seed" of an idea would create a nonprofit organization. NWABA is an organization that is now impacting more than 1,500 children, youth, adults and military veterans annually who are blind or visually impaired.

NWABA works across Washington, Oregon, Idaho and Montana, bringing opportunities to individuals of all ages and abilities with visual impairments so that everyone who needs our help can participate in sport and physical activity. Through participation in NWABA's programs, individuals are building confidence and the skills, tools, and resources they need to achieve success in all areas of life. The opportunity to ride a bike for the first time, meet others with visual impairments, or be a part of a team again after losing your vision is the catalyst our athletes need to reach their greatest potential.

Together last year, we made huge strides. With the support of passionate volunteers, dedicated partners, and generous support from our community, we:

- Expanded program opportunities in new geographic areas like Eugene, Oregon, and deepened impact through more ongoing service offerings which resulted in more individuals and families being served than ever before.
- Drastically increased the organization's Adapted Equipment Lending Library to more than 500 pieces to ensure individuals always have access to programming in their local home, school or community.
- Increased the number of students impacted to 50+ at Camp Abilities Oregon to ensure more children and youth with visual impairments have the opportunity to go to camp. Reaching kids early has an impact for life.
- Advanced our proven organization growth model into other communities in our service region to deepen our mission impact.



CAMP ABILITIES

FOR ONE WEEK IN THE SUMMER, campers, counselors,

specialists, nurses and NWABA staff join together for an unforgettable experience. Camp is a residential camp staffed by counselors, specialists, and volunteers all working to ensure that each camper is having an experience that will transcend camp and an impact that will last a lifetime. Campers are 8 to 15 years of age and activities include Goalball, judo, swimming, tandem cycling, hiking and many other activities.

Campers come to Camp Abilities to gain skills and participate in new activities; however, so much more happens during the week. Friendships are forged and kindness is shown to each other through "care to share" time and encouragement through "smiley-grams."

Camp Abilities Oregon strives to ensure that when each camper leaves, they are equipped with the skills and experience to participate in their school or community-based programing. This is accomplished through a comprehensive evaluation that is sent home with each camper and regular communication with families. NWABA is excited to expand Camp Abilities to Washington State in FY18-19 and has plans for continued growth in the years to come.





SPORTS ADAPTATIONS

EQUIPPING SCHOOLS & COMMUNITIES

Through the Sports Adaptations Program, Northwest Association for Blind Athletes provides adaptations and consultations to individuals of all ages and abilities with visual impairments across the region to allow them to better integrate into their physical education classes and community-based programs. We work with individuals, parents, and PE teachers to make sure that any individual has access to sports and physical activity.

Through the support of friends like you and dedicated program partners, the Sports Adaptations Program is providing consultations to schools, lending equipment to families, and providing resources so that every individual has access to opportunities in their local home, school and community.

- Physical Education Consultation NWABA's program works with teachers to ensure
 that children and youth who are blind or visually impaired receive equipment, specialized
 instruction and encouragement to allow them to participate without barriers in school and
 community-based programming.
- O Adapted Equipment Lending Library Started in 2017, the lending library is made up of more than 500 individual pieces of equipment that are "loaned" to registered athletes for up to two months at no charge to students, families or schools.
- Video Resource Center NWABA is actively working to build the Video Resource Library to deepen our impact and reach more individuals and families in need than ever before. We have developed instructional videos for different physical activities for individuals with visual impairments. This way, individuals, parents, and friends can watch to see how best to engage in programming.

CREATING COMMUNITY, FULFILLING DREAMS, INCREASING VISIBILITY

Sports Team Program - This program provides year-round opportunities for individuals to participate in team-based programming in Goalball & Dragon Boating across NWABA's service area. At the heart of the Sports Teams Program, and all of NWABA's services, is an inclusive community of supporters. Through this valuable program, athletes learn to work as a team, relieve stress, eliminate isolation and depression and build life-long friendships.

Scholarship Program – Every year, individuals with visual impairments dream of going to the world championships, competing in their local community-based program, or buying a pair of shoes to start running, but the cost to participate is a barrier for most athletes. Funding for this critical program provides adaptive equipment, travel support, registration fees, shoes and other support to help fulfill our athletes' dreams and give them the opportunity to train and compete.

Increasing Visibility Program – Often referred to as outreach, this simple activity brings awareness to communities, attracts athletes to the program and engages "investors" in our work. From public events, to speaking opportunities, it's vital for NWABA to go where people go and use sports and physical activity to raise awareness about the abilities of individuals with visual impairments.


