



Job Description: O&M Intern

Job Summary: Reporting to the Camp Spark Co-Directors, the Camp Spark O&M Intern will deliver O&M instruction in a camp setting directly to children and youth with visual impairments at Camp Spark under the supervision of a COMS. The O&M intern(s) will work in a team providing orientation and mobility to campers throughout the week.

Responsibilities

- Complete environmental assessment of camp environment prior to camper arrival
- Review assigned campers' O&M independence inventories prior to start of sessions
- Assess campers upon their arrival at camp to determine their independence level and routes
- Observe multiple camper O&M lessons given by COMS
- Plan and implement instruction in 4 designated levels of O&M under the guidance of the COMS
- Develop and implement at least 2 O&M lesson plans for assigned campers and schedule time with COMS for observation of these lessons
- Identify best instructional strategies for assigned campers during lessons
- Communicate verbally and in writing best instructional strategies identified to campers' counselors in a professional manner
- Develop tactile maps to assist in campers' orientation of camp setting and sports
- Assist group leaders and counselors with campers as needed in the area of O&M (offering reminders and coaching as needed)
- Work with counselors to identify and communicate best pull-out times for lessons
- Communicate with group leaders to identify best times for push-in lessons
- Complete O&M assessments for assigned campers
- • Provide excellent customer service to athletes, team members, partner agencies, and families with high levels of professionalism at all times
- Other duties as assigned by Camp Spark Co-Directors or Executive Director, such as assisting with tandem biking captaining, guide running, meal serving, etc.



Required Expectations

- Set a good example in all you do at camp
- Refrain from possessing and using legal and illegal recreational drugs, tobacco, and alcohol during agreed upon term
- Must be in an accredited Orientation and Mobility Program
- Must be 19 years or older
- Must be able to pass background checks including a check of the National Sex Offender Registry
- Ability to commit to being on duty 24/7 during the time that camp is in session

- Must have access to a laptop, computer, or tablet with Microsoft Excel and experience using Microsoft forms during sessions
- Ability to complete all virtual orientations preceding sessions. Information about virtual orientations will be provided prior to the start of the session(s).
- For interns working the summer sessions, in person orientations will be as follows at the same location as the session:
 - For staff working session 7:
 - July 3-4, 2024
 - Staff will have some time off on July 4
 - For staff working either session 1 and/or session 2:
 - July 13-14, 2024
 - Virtual option will be available to staff not working session 1

Desired Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Ability to be moderately active and able to physically engage for 12-14 hours daily
- Ability to self-direct and work well without constant supervision



- Ability to demonstrate high levels of enthusiasm, energy, and initiative at all times
- Ability and experience in captaining a tandem bike
- Ability to demonstrate excellent oral and written communication skills
- Experience and intermediate skill in MS Excel and Microsoft forms
- Ability to lift and carry up to 40lbs, including tandem bikes, kayaks, and other adaptive equipment on a regular basis
- Experience working with individuals with visual impairments or other physical disabilities
- Pre-professional or professional experience in visual impairments, physical education, or physical activity
- Current First Aid and CPR certification

Compensation

- O&M interns working summer sessions (Sessions 1-2, & 7) will receive a stipend which will be commensurate with experience
- School year sessions (Sessions 3-6) are volunteer and no stipend is provided
- Room and board will be provided during the time that camp is in session. O&M practicum hours will correlate to the length of each session
- Seasonal:
 - Summer sessions. All summer sessions start at 8AM on the first day of the session and conclude at 2PM on the last day.

 - Session 1: July 13-19, 2024

 - School year positions. These positions are dependent upon the availability of a supervising COMS.
